Kingston Choral Society begins its season with a work shrouded in myth and intrigue: **Mozart's** remarkable *Requiem*. Commissioned by a shadowy stranger in mysterious circumstances, its dark, sombre palette suggests that the superstitious Mozart suspected he had been asked to write his own epitaph; the work was left incomplete on his premature death. In contrast, **Mozart's Solemn Vespers** are anything but solemn – expect a riot of effervescent, joyful choral colour!

Kingston Choral Society celebrated its 60th anniversary in 2010 with a performance of Handel's Messiah, the work with which the Society was launched. It has developed its reputation for performing concerts of high standard, with recent performances including Bach's St John Passion, Haydn's Creation and Verdi's Requiem at Cadogan Hall, Brahms' Ein deutsches Requiem, Mendelssohn's Elijah, Poulenc's Gloria, Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610, Howells' Hymnus Paradisi, Handel's Solomon and the world première of Graham Ross' And since to look at things in bloom.
